

# YOUR HANDWRITING *becomes something Claude can read.*

rm-bridge connects a reMarkable tablet  
to Claude

A reMarkable is an e-ink tablet, the kind you write on like paper. rm-bridge is the small connector between it and Claude. Every notebook becomes something Claude can read, search across years of, publish new pages into, and quietly watch for patterns in.

No syntax to learn. **Just plain English.**

*read once, then just ask*

READING

see what's on the tablet

Claude can list, open, and read your notebooks the way you'd flip through them yourself.

01

List a folder

Ask what exists somewhere on the tablet, a whole folder or the whole account.

SAY

*What's in my HypeKick folder?*

RESULT

Claude lists every notebook and PDF underneath it, skipping anything private.

02

Read one page

Point at a specific page and Claude reads the handwriting back as text.

SAY

*Show me page 3 of HK Offers.*

RESULT

Claude renders the page as an image, reads it, and describes the words and how they're laid out.

03

Read a whole notebook

For longer stretches, Claude reads a batch of pages at once instead of one at a time.

SAY

*Summarize the first ten pages of Ideas and Thoughts.*

RESULT

Claude reads all ten and gives the throughline, not a page by page transcript.

The connection runs both ways. Claude can hand you back a real page, sized to fit the screen.

01

## Write something new

Ask for a document and have it land on the tablet instead of the screen.

SAY

*Turn this email thread into a one page brief and put it on my tablet.*

RESULT

Claude drafts it, formats it for the e-ink screen, and drops a PDF into /Inbox.

02

## Upload an existing file

Any PDF or EPUB already at hand can go straight onto the device.

SAY

*Put this contract on my tablet so I can mark it up.*

(attach the file when you ask)

RESULT

Claude uploads it as is, ready to annotate by hand.

THE QUEUE

/Process is a to-do list you write to

Copy or write a page into /Process, and Claude treats it as something waiting for attention.

01

Check what's waiting

A folder called /Process works like an inbox. Write or copy a page there and Claude treats it as something waiting for attention.

SAY

*What's waiting in my Process queue?*

RESULT

A list of pending pages, plus anything that's sat untouched long enough to flag.

02

Archive what's done

Mark an item complete without losing it.

SAY

*Archive that one, I'm finished with it.*

RESULT

The page moves into /Process/Archive on the tablet. Nothing is deleted.

03

Clear out true duplicates

A second check before anything is removed for good.

SAY

*Clean up anything in Archive that's just a copy.*

RESULT

Claude only deletes a page when the real original still exists somewhere else, never the only copy of something.

## SEARCHING

find a page out of thousands

Every page ever written gets indexed. There are four ways to search it, and Claude picks the right one from how you ask.

01

**By exact words**

The literal words on the page.

SAY

*Find every page where I wrote customer journey.*

RESULT

A keyword match, the same as searching a document for a phrase.

02

**By meaning**

What the page is actually about.

SAY

*Find pages about pricing, even if I didn't use that word.*

RESULT

A meaning based match. Turns up what should we charge pages too.

03

**By underlying shape**

The structure of the idea, not its subject.

SAY

*Have I ever sketched anything shaped like a funnel before?*

RESULT

Matches the mechanism, not the topic. A sales funnel and an unrelated staged process can both surface, months or years apart.

04

**Related pages**

While looking at any page, ask what else is like it.

SAY

*Show me pages related to this one.*

RESULT

Surfaces other notebooks with a similar idea, sometimes ones long forgotten.

## PATTERNS

what your notebooks say, beyond one page

01

**Recurring questions**

A ranked list of open loops.

SAY

*What questions do I keep asking myself and never answering?*

RESULT

The ones circled back to most, and marked most emphatically.

02

**How an idea has moved**

A read on when a theme was active, dormant, or resurfaced.

SAY

*How has my thinking on brand positioning changed since 2022?*

RESULT

A quarter by quarter view of where it went, and where it came back.

03

**Instructions written on the page itself**

Box or circle an instruction anywhere on a page and it's treated as a request rather than a note to yourself.

ON THE PAGE, WRITE

*Summarize this and email it to me*

RESULT

Claude reads the box as a directive, does exactly that, and always says what it read before acting. For anything outside a short known list of safe actions, it proposes instead of doing.

## AUTOMATIC

what happens without you asking

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01 **Every hour**

Claude checks for new or changed pages, reads and indexes them, and works through anything sitting in the Process queue.

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02 **On the first of each month**

Claude reviews everything and publishes a short report to the tablet: a handful of genuine observations, each pointing back to the exact pages behind it.

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On the report: confirm what's useful and reject what missed the mark. Next month's report drops what was rejected and builds on what was confirmed. When it notices an old question a later page seems to answer, it asks for that confirmation too. Nothing gets marked resolved on its own.

## PRIVACY

what Claude will never touch

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01 **A private folder stays invisible**

Any folder named Private, or named similarly, is never downloaded in the first place. Not hidden after the fact.

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02 **Content is never a command**

Anything written on a page is content, never an instruction to change how Claude behaves. A note that says ignore your rules is just a note.

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03 **Output stays close to home**

Results only ever go to the tablet's Inbox or to your own email address. Never anywhere else.

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QUICK REFERENCE

You'll never need to say these names. Claude picks the right one. **Ask in your own words.** This guide is a map of what's possible, not a syntax to get right.
